History tour

Beaumanor Hall's history tour offers visitors a fascinating experience.

A hidden gem nestled within Leicestershire's Charnwood Forest, Beaumanor Hall has been visited for centuries by poets, goldsmiths, royalty and now you!

To help interested groups we conduct guided tours of the main hall, cellars as well as some of the buildings erected around the grounds.

The tour will cover a brief history from the establishment of the estate to the current Neo-Jacobean property built for the last member of the Herrick family in the Victorian era.

During World War II and the Cold War, Beaumanor was requisitioned by the War Office and became a major hub of operation for the Y-Service, the listening stations which intercepted enemy communications and sent them on for decoding at the famous Bletchley Park. The tour provides insight into the

working conditions and lives of the listeners.

Other places of interest include the air raid shelter, armoury, Victorian working rooms and beautiful formal gardens.

Our guides are extremely knowledgeable and help bring the history of Beaumanor Hall to life. Each tour lasts approximately 3.5 hours and includes a break for refreshments and biscuits. Please note that access to the upper floor is only available by staircase.
