We have arranged an exciting and fun packed schedule of activities for your children to take part in during the school holidays.

Beaumanor Activities offers a superb range of activities which are available to all children aged between 7-14 years at the time of attending. We are unable to accept children outside of this age range. All activities are staffed by qualified and experienced teachers and instructors.

SEN

Whilst we aim to accommodate a wide range of additional needs, we are unable to provide one to one supervision. If your child requires a 'one to one' in the school setting it is unlikely that our sessions would be suitable. If you are unsure, please contact us directly prior to booking.

DATES

The programme of activities for May Half Term 2026 is on page 3 of this document. Sometimes it may be necessary to include additional activities depending upon the weather and/or group size, age range or abilities.

TIMINGS

***PLEASE NOTE NEW TIMINGS FOR THE DAY**

The activity part of day will commence at 09.00am and finish at 16.30pm however you are welcome to drop off after 8.30am and pick up by 17.00pm at the latest at no extra cost.

COST

The standard cost of the day is £45.00 per child per day (£40 per sibling per day when purchasing one full price child ticket) and is fully inclusive of all activities. Please note that lunch is not provided and children should bring their own packed lunch.

DROP OFF/COLLECTION

On arrival park in the main Beaumanor Car Park, then follow the 'Holiday Club' signs to the base room to drop off or collect your child.

IMPORTANT

Each child will be allocated a number and the person leaving the child will be given a token with the number corresponding to their child. ONLY the adult with this token will be permitted to collect their child in the afternoon unless an alternative pre-arranged system has been put in place.



WHAT WILL CHILDREN NEED TO BRING?

- Packed lunch and drinks
- Suitable activity clothes (due to the nature of activities clothes may get wet, dirty or damaged)
- Trainers/walking boots (no open toe shoes or sandals)
- Change of clothes, shoes and a plastic bag for any wet clothes especially important for water sport activities
- Sun cream and sun hat (for sunny weather)
- Any medication your child requires (with name on medication)
- A small amount of money for the gift shop (optional).

Please do not send your child with mobile phones and other electronic gadgets as we cannot be responsible for loss, damage or content sharing. If any child is found with a mobile phone or other electronic gadget it will be locked away and returned at the end of the day.

Full payment is made at time of booking and recorded on Eventbrite.

If using this option, you are required to email verification of voucher transfer as soon as possible following making your booking to holidayclub@leics.gov.uk stating which company you have used. Failure to verify your voucher transfer could result in your place being reallocated to another child. **Please note Childcare Vouchers are not refundable under any circumstances.**

Activities in Detail

All activities are run by experienced and highly qualified staff. The activities are designed to promote teamwork and to build confidence and to encourage children to try new activities whilst making new friends along the way. These may be subject to change at the last minute due to circumstances beyond our control.

- **Climbing**

Experience the challenge of climbing. Participants will have the opportunity to learn new skills and be introduced to some of the technical elements of the sport of rock climbing. All technical equipment is provided.

- **Water Sports (Canoeing and/or Kayaking)**

This is a day with water as the main focus. We will use different kinds of boats on the water and children will have the opportunity to go canoeing and sometimes kayaking. The venues for the water sports day will be either the Soar River/canal in Quorn and Barrow or Watermead Country Park. As this activity is off site the children will be required to travel in our minibuses. Please bring a change of clothes and shoes as you are very likely to get wet.

- **High Ropes**

A superb way for children to work together and challenge themselves in a safe and fun environment. Our High Ropes Course comprises of a number of different elements. It is unlikely all elements will be covered in one day. Minimum Weight 20kg (3.15 stone) Maximum Weights depend on the elements (see list below) a selection of the most appropriate for the group will be offered depending upon availability:

Aerial Trek: Walk the ropes and poles course, 9 metres above the ground.

Leap of Faith: Climb a 9.5m pole and leap to catch the trapeze bar.

Zip Wire: Journey 150m from the top of our 11.5m tower.

Vertical Challenge: Have a go on our 8-metre climb over ladders, tyres, nets, and other obstacles to reach the top – if you make it!

Quick Jump: Take the 11.5 metre leap into space using our quick-jump, free fall device. Minimum 20kg (3.15 stone) Maximum Weight 130kg (20 stone).

Crate Stack: Work in small teams to construct your own tower using milk bottle crates. Build the highest tower in the time given to be crowned the champions.

- **Archery**

Experience the thrill of archery where you can test your own 'eye for a target'. We have both indoor and outdoor ranges depending upon the weather. You will be shown the safety for the range, take part in a competition and play some games using the bows and arrows.

- **Survival and Bushcraft**

Using the superb woodland in Beaumanor Park and the local area, you will learn basic survival and bush craft skills, build your own woodland shelter, and enjoy the creativity of cooking on an open fire. This may also include a visit to local country parks requiring transport in our minibuses.



- **Outdoor Fun Day**

On this day the children will get to test their problem-solving skills through different activities. They will make new friends while working as a team. The choice of activities will be guided by the children as we have far too many options to put in this information. Children may have tried some activities if they have come with school and others that are saved just for the holiday club. Other activities may include making bridges using wooden poles and ropes, make sure your knots are tight or you might get wet, or our land buggies, making a go kart using barrels, poles and ropes. Other games can include capture the flag, cellars and familiar wide games.

- **Woodland Fun Day**

Experience the wild outdoors and get up close with Nature, exploring habitats, the birds and minibeasts that occupy the Beaumanor Woodlands, and the bushcraft skills needed for humans to survive in the wilderness. Activities may include pond dipping, scavenger hunts, constructing a bird feeder, woodland themed games, shelter building and fire lighting.

- **Operation Rescue**

Immerse yourself in a world of secret agents... Your task, should you choose to accept, will involve scaling our climbing wall and abseiling down to retrieve secret encoded documents revealing the whereabouts of a missing agent. You will need to show courage, trust, and good problem solving skills to rescue your comrade before time runs out. Activities may include orienteering and map reading, building a bridge, and elements of climbing/abseiling.
